We have welcomed the Government's additional funding given to school so that they can support their disadvantaged pupils and close the attainment gap between them and their peers.

In 2014-15 Carterknowle received £52,000 in pupil premium funding. This was spent on: intervention programmes, extra small group and one to one support, trips, clubs and activities.

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We are delighted that 100% of the children eligible for pupil premium achieved level 4 or above in 2015 in reading, writing, EGPS and maths for the first time since the Pupil Premium funding began. This is as a result of more effective targeting of support to need through intervention programmes and in-class support from teaching assistants and shows that we use the Pupil Premium well to impact on children's learning. This is a strength of the school in 2015.
