Driver 1: Citizenship


Enable children to make their own decisions and take responsibility for their own lives and communities.

PE

- Develop flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance [for example, through athletics and gymnastics]

RE

Explore and respond thoughtfully to the spiritual paths of Muslims, Hindus or Buddhists, using a range of sources of wisdom.

Describe the impact of examples of religious teaching. A Hindu example might be the impact of Hindu teaching about harmlessness (ahimsa) on questions about what we eat and how we treat animals. A Muslim example might be the impact of daily prayer and Zakat (alms giving) on how Muslim individuals and communities live. A Buddhist example might be about the practice of harmlessness.
